



## PSAT/NMSQT for Juniors ONLY on SATURDAY - 10/14/2023

Stuyvesant High School administers the PSAT/NMSQT every October during a regular school day. However, this year's PSAT/NMSQT will be a digital version, which requires the school to make adjustments to administer the examination successfully in this new format. Therefore, we will administer the **PSAT/NMSQT on Saturday, October 14, 2023, in the morning and afternoon**. Stuyvesant will automatically register all juniors to take the exam and there is no cost to students/families for



this 10/14/23 PSAT/NMSQT administration. Please note, students are not required to take the exam, and no notification is necessary to the school if you decide to *not* take the exam during this Saturday administration. The reason for administering the examination on a Saturday rather than on a school day are the following:

- Digital version of the PSAT/NMSQT requires a configured device that the school will provide for all test takers.
- Ensure minimal technical issues due to bandwidth usage within the building.

Avoid loss of an instructional day for all students.

We will have two sessions:

• Morning Window: 9:00 AM - 12:00 PM

• Afternoon Window: 12:30 PM - 3:00 PM

We will randomly assign students to one of the two windows, so if you plan on taking the PSAT/NMSQT through the school, then we ask that you hold the 10/14 date. We will not take preference requests so please be prepared for either of the two sessions when you are assigned. More details will follow soon. In the interim, we recommend that you familiarize yourself with what to expect and to practice this new version of the exam. We recommend you visit the College Board site for more information about the <a href="PSAT/NMSQT">PSAT/NMSQT</a>. Additionally, the school has provided you with a PSAT prep software called <a href="PrepScholar">PrepScholar</a> -- a self-paced adaptive test prep focused on more than 100 skill lessons and 7,100+ practice questions with explanations. You should have received an email to your Stuy.edu account in August from <a href="PrepScholar">PrepScholar</a>, so please check so you can register and use the platform immediately.

#### **Registration AMC A Exam**

On Wednesday, November 8, 2023, the Mathematics

Department will be administering the AMC 10A/12A exams (American Mathematics Competition) after school. To be eligible for the AMC 10 exams, students must be in grades 9 or 10 and must have been born after 5/8/2006.

#### AMC B Exam

The AMC 10B/12B exams will be held on Tuesday, November 14, 2023 after school. Students in grades 11 or 12 can register for the AMC 12 exam. They must have been born after 5/8/2004. Students may take one exam or both. Taking both exams gives students two chances to qualify for the next round of exams, the American Invitational Math Exam (AIME).

#### **Math Team Students**

All students in Math Team are required to take the AMC 10A/12A exam and are automatically registered for it. Their fees for the AMC A exam will be paid for by the Math Team. If they wish to take the 10B/12B exam as well, they should complete the form to register for the AMC B exam only.





## 9th graders wishing to take the SHSAT or transfer --- see Ms. Rhiman

If you are a current 9th grader who wishes to take the SHSAT or transfer to another high school, please see School Counselor, Ms. Shakira Rhiman in room 236 for application help. Below , she shares instructions and helpful guidelines:

Students who are registering for the exam should NOT indicate Stuyvesant on their registration ticket.

Families will be able to register for the SHSAT on October 3 through their MySchools account.



Any students who are having trouble with their MySchools account should contact Ntang5@schools.nyc.gov The SHSAT registration closes on October 27th.

**Here's how to apply online:** Use <u>MySchools</u> to explore high school options, and talk with your school counselor about your application choices.

Be sure to place programs in your true order of preference, with your first choice as #1. Applying to 12 programs, any of which you'd be happy to attend, makes it more likely that you'll get an offer to a program of your choice.

Check the "Selection Criteria" section of each program's MySchools page to see if that program has any additional admissions requirements. For example, audition programs require an audition, and some screened programs require applicants to complete an interview or essay. Find out how to prepare auditions for any programs that require them, including for Fiorello H. LaGuardia High School of Music & Art and Performing Arts, NYC's audition <a href="Specialized High School">Specialized High School</a>, in <a href="MySchools(Open external link">MySchools(Open external link</a>) or on our <a href="Auditions page">Auditions page</a>. Learn how screened schools will make offers this year on our <a href="Screened Admissions page">Screened Admissions page</a>.



Senator Kristin Gillibrand is hosting a Virtual Service Academy Night on September 27, 2023 beginning at 6 p.m. to learn about the application and nomination process. Representatives from the U.S. Merchant Marine Academy and the other federal service academies will be there to answer questions. **Here** is a flyer with details and RSVP information.

Four of the five academies – U.S. Naval Academy (USNA), U.S. Military Academy (USMA), U.S. Air Force Academy (USAFA), and U.S. Merchant Marine Academy



(USMMA) – require applicants to apply for and receive a congressional nomination from either a U.S. Representative or a U.S. Senator. In addition to their two U.S. senators, applicants to USMMA may apply to any and all members of congress in their state. This affords USMMA applicants more opportunities to secure these coveted appointments.
