Registration AMC A Exam

On Wednesday, November 8, 2023, the Mathematics

Department will be administering the AMC 10A/12A exams (American Mathematics Competition) after school. To be eligible for the AMC 10 exams, students must be in grades 9 or 10 and must have been born after 5/8/2006.

AMC B Exam

The AMC 10B/12B exams will be held on Tuesday, November 14, 2023 after school. Students in grades 11 or 12 can register for the AMC 12 exam. They must have been born after 5/8/2004. Students may take one exam or both. Taking both exams gives students two chances to qualify for the next round of exams, the American Invitational Math Exam (AIME).

Math Team Students

All students in Math Team are required to take the AMC 10A/12A exam and are automatically registered for it. Their fees for the AMC A exam will be paid for by the Math Team. If they wish to take the 10B/12B exam as well, they should complete the form to register for the AMC B exam only.



Seniors: Sending ACT/SAT scores to colleges

Please remember that Stuyvesant HS cannot sent ACT or SAT scores to colleges. Students must arrange to have test scores sent directly to the colleges to which they're applying from the appropriate testing agency. Students can do so by using their online accounts at either www.actstudent.org or www.collegeboard.org and following the related prompts within.



Please note that <u>many colleges now accept self-reported scores</u> and may not require official school reports until you eventually enroll in the spring. Check your college websites to see if you can rely on self-reporting for any of the colleges to which you'll apply. However, several universities very popular with Stuy students including Carnegie Mellon University, Georgetown U., NYU, Princeton, SUNY Stony Brook, and SUNY Buffalo U. many others DO NOT ACCEPT SELF-REPORTED SCORES. If you are applying to any of these colleges you must have an official score report sent to each.


Know that sending scores online from ACT and CollegeBoard is a process that takes several weeks. To be safe, make sure to make your score send requests online well in advance of application deadlines!

Remember also that many colleges are test-optional; that means you can apply without scores. However, test -optional colleges will still consider scores if submitted; if you tested and your scores are within or above that college's mid-50% range for admitted students, you should still submit your scores.

Brooklyn Public Library's Home Internet Access Program

Want to lower your internet bill? Eligible NYC households can save \$30/month with help from Brooklyn Public Library's Home Internet Access Program. **Who Qualifies**

To be eligible for the program, you or your dependent must meet ONE of the following criteria:

Free & Low-Cost Internet Plans

• You participate in one of the following government assistance programs: SNAP, Medicaid, WIC, SSI, Veterans Pension, Federal Pell Grant, or Housing Assistance. ORYour child attends a NYC public school and most charter schools, ORYour household income is 200% or less than the federal poverty guidelines (for example: less than \$39,440 for a household of 2, etc.

Need help with the application? Get one-on-one assistance from a BPL digital navigator located at participating libraries throughout Brooklyn.


