Today, October 23, we will open the **payment portal for AP Exams**. Registration has been ongoing with students receiving their join codes from their teachers to register on their College Board accounts. **Payments for exams are due by November 8**. Students who are not enrolled in AP courses may only obtain registration information by applying for an exception through the instructions that will be emailed today to students and families. Every student and family will receive the detailed instructions today regardless of whether they are currently enrolled in AP courses. Please read them carefully and thoroughly. We understand many are interested in being considered for an exception to take an AP Exam that they self study for. This exception application is limited to one per student per year and decisions are based upon space availability and discussion between the testing coordinator and the department chair.

On Tuesday, October 24 the monthly meeting of the **SLT (School Leadership Team)** will be held at 3:45 pm in the principal's conference room. An agenda is linked in this update and will cover a discussion of student supports from Assistant Principal, I.A., Gina Paulson.

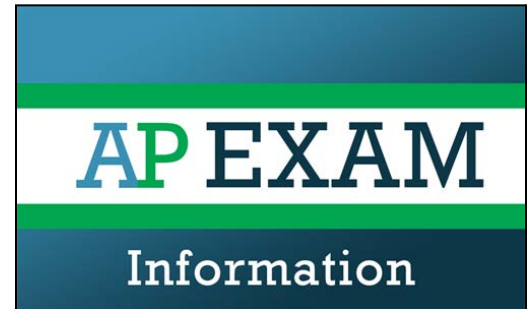

AP Exam Payment Portal Opens - Deadline 11/8/2023

Fall registration for Advanced Placement (AP) exams has been ongoing. AP exam registration is required for students who desire to sit for AP exam(s) and can *only* be completed by students at [My AP](#). Students use the Join Code provided by their teachers if currently enrolled in an AP course. Students who wish to self study for an AP Exam must apply for an exception. **Payment for AP exams is a separate step from AP exam registration. All instructions and details will be provided via email to students and families.**

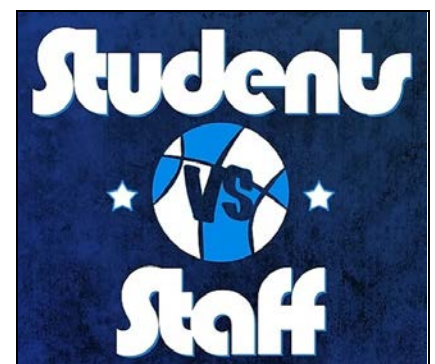

NOTE: Students who qualify for economic hardship have historically had their AP exams fees paid for by the NYC Department of Education (NYC DOE). If the letter they received from Stuyvesant indicates a status of "NO COST", students should register only; and not go to the payment portal. This does not include late registration fees and/or no show and cancellation fees. Do not check off or pay late fees if you register by November 8, 2023. Families may complete the [Family Income Inquiry Form](#) if the source indicated on their letter from Stuyvesant reads "No Application". You may fill out the form online to ratify your status. This takes several days to reflect entries and/or changes in the school's system. Fees must be paid by the deadline whether the status changes or not. You may check the status with Ms. Fanelli in room 209 or at gfanelli@schools.nyc.gov.

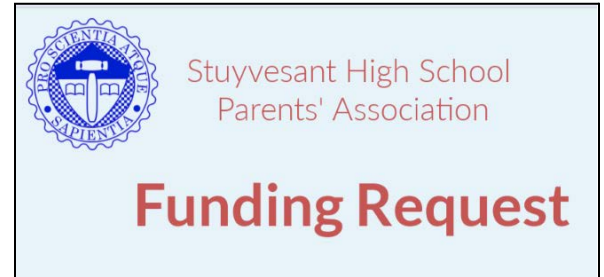
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PA Spring 2024 Funding Requests! Deadline 11/8/ 2023

Assistant Principal of Safety & Security, Mr. Brian Moran advises all students: **Please make sure to take extra care while traveling** as the days get shorter.

- Financial need
- Community involvement
- Personal statement
- Personal qualities and strengths as portrayed in a personal interview, either in-person or by phone

Winners are selected by June. (Check for emails by April to find out if you are a semi-finalist.)

Are you eligible?

Check out the requirements below to find out if the McDonald's® HACER® National Scholarship is right for you:

- You're a **high school senior**
- Must be a legal U.S. Resident, U.S. Citizen or a DREAMER/DACA recipient
- You're under 21 years old
- You carry a minimum 2.8 GPA

Big Apple Connect Program Expansion through 2027 (Free WiFi!)

More than 330,000 NYCHA residents in 150,000 households citywide now have access to free, fast, reliable, and safe broadband internet and cable through [Big Apple Connect](#). As of **August 1, 2023**, the program was expanded to the **17 public housing developments**. A full listing of Big Apple Connect eligible NYCHA developments are available [here](#).

NYCHA residents without existing home internet are able to sign up for Big Apple Connect with either Optimum or Spectrum (service provider will depend on the location). Existing Optimum



and Spectrum customers will have their bills reduced to as low as \$0, as monthly internet and basic cable TV charges are eliminated.

NYCHA residents in eligible developments are eligible to receive a package which includes:

- FREE internet connections with download speeds of up to 300 Mbps
- FREE wireless router
- FREE modem
- FREE basic cable TV
- FREE cable box and remote control

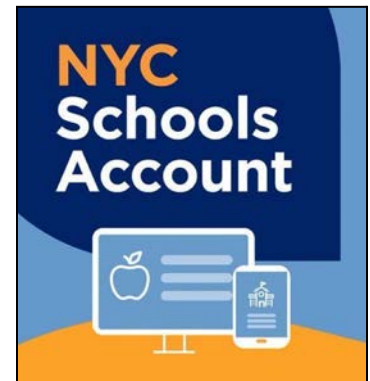

NYCSA Mobile Application: Parents/guardians who have an active [NYCSA account](#) can access their child's transcripts and attendance using the NYCSA mobile application that can be downloaded on [iOS](#) and [Android](#) devices. Need an account? Reach out to Ms. Tang at ntang5@schools.nyc.gov.

Important for parents: Your NYCSA account is the controlling account for all your school accounts. The email address you use there will carry over to all your parent school accounts including Talos and Jupiter, etc. So if you give your account to your child -- you will not have parent accounts, nor will will receive report cards and email from us. NYCSA is NOT a student account! It's your personal parent/guardian account and we will use the email address there for all communication to you.

RockEdu: LAB Jumpstart & SSRP Information Sessions – 10/23 or 11/13

Research Coordinator, Dr. Meng Ping Tu shares that both these programs only accept current juniors or seniors, and both PROHIBIT students use any part of the coursework or research project for science competitions. Hence, current Research students should not apply to these programs.

This program may benefit students who are not in the Research Track but are curious about what conducting research is like. All applications are due on Friday,



January 5, 2024 at 11:59pm Eastern Time. Letters of recommendation are due on Monday, January 8, 2024 at 11:59pm Eastern Time.

SSRP scholars will be on campus up to 35 hours per week during normal business hours

Applicants must be current high school juniors or seniors

Accepted students must be age 16+ at program start – no exceptions – and must commit to the entire program.
