The Stuy PA's South Asian Parents of Stuy (SAPOS) Outreach committee had a wonderful celebration in Manhattan this past weekend with more than 85 in attendance celebrating together!

Tomorrow, **Tuesday**, **November 7 is a student non-attendance day** in observance of Election Day. The staff will be fully remote and engage in professional development virtually.

Last week, Stuyvesant celebrated **Stuyloween**; our annual Halloween celebration with delivery of BooGram candygrams in homerooms and costume contests! Please note that Principal Yu will be taking a short leave beginning on Friday, November 10 and will return to Stuvyesant on Monday, November 27. During this time, Assistant Principal, Dr. Gary Haber will be Principal in Charge.

This week we will host the last chance for senior yearbook photos today; a parent workshop in person for Sophomore families on Wednesday at 6:30pm, another parent workshop on Thursday morning virtually for

Korean speaking families as well as an Organizational Day event for students all day;*and* host special alumnus guest, Eric Holder at 10:30am in the theater! We'll end the week with the Big Sib/Little Sib Dance on Friday after school. It's a full week!

Registration has been ongoing for AP Exams with students receiving their join codes from their teachers to register on their College Board accounts. The deadline for **registration and payments for exams is November 8.** <u>This includes a deadline for indicating "yes" or "no" to whether a student will take the exam. Students left "undecided" incur a \$40 fee for changes from the college board after 11/15.</u> Students who applied for exceptions by the deadline of 10/29 received decisions and instructions from Dr. Haber last week.

We will host **Fall Parent Teacher Conferences** on November 16 (evening) and November 17 (afternoon). The conferences are remote via phone call. **You must request through Talos to receive calls.** You may request anytime between November 2 at 8am and November 9 at 5pm. It is not first come first served. We will take all requests entered on Talos between 11/2-11/9, and an algorithm will determine appointments assigning the maximum number of conferences to each teacher. Please read the detailed instructions you received via email last week and in this update.

AP Exam Payment Portal Open - Deadline 11/8/2023

Fall registration for Advanced Placement (AP) exams has been ongoing. AP exam registration is required for students who desire to sit for AP exam(s) and can *only* be completed by students at <u>My</u> <u>AP</u>. Students use the Join Code provided by their teachers if currently enrolled in an AP course. Students who wish to self study for an AP Exam must apply for an exception. *Payment for AP exams is a separate step from AP exam registration.* All instructions and details will be provided via email to students and families. **TIMELINE**

- Payment portal opens 10/23/2023
- Deadline to apply for exception 10/29/23
- Notification of approval of Exceptions from Dr. Haber 11/1/23
- Payment portal closes 11/8/2023
- Stuyvesant High School AP Exam Schedule release 1/30/2024

NOTE: Students who qualify for economic hardship have historically had their AP exams fees paid for by the NYC Department of Education (NYC DOE). If the letter they received from Stuyvesant indicates a status of "NO COST", students should register only; and not go to the payment portal. This does not include late registration fees and/or no show and cancellation fees. Do not check off or pay late fees if you register by November 8, 2023. Families may complete the <u>Family Income Inquiry Form</u> if the source indicated on their letter from Stuyvesant reads "No Application". You may fill out the form online to ratify your status. This takes several days to reflect entries and/or changes in the school's system. Fees must be paid by the deadline whether the status changes or not. You may check the status with Ms. Fanelli in room 209 or at <u>gfanelli@schools.nyc.gov</u>.

Join! "Computer Animation: How to Use Math to Make Art" 11/9!

Art teacher Mr. Wrigley shares that this Thursday at 4:00 pm in the lecture hall, Dr. Theodore Kim, Associate Professor of Computer Science at Yale University will talk about computer animation as an intersection of mathematics and artistic thinking, and the limitations of both. He'll talk about the interrelation between Asian Americans and STEM over the past several decades, and show examples of computer animation as applications of mathematics and physics. He'll also detail the mysterious past of an early Asian American computer graphics pioneer whose algorithms are the reason why TOY STORY...is about toys.

Dr. Theodore Kim, Associate Professor of Computer Science at Yale University, previously worked as Senior Research Scientist at Pixar Animation Studios, where he received screen credits for Cars 3, Coco, Incredibles 2, and Toy Story 4. His algorithms have appeared in over 20 films, and he received Scientific and Technical Academy Awards in both 2012 and 2022.



Now that we are past November 1, please remember that Dr. Shere is still available to provide college essay or supplemental essay review for ANY senior applying with the November 15, December 1, or RD deadlines. If you would like to receive feedback from Dr. Shere on any of these essays, you can share them with Dr. Shere via Google (cshere@stuy.edu) along with the following information:

- Essay should be in a clean google doc (no other existing comments)
- Prompt or supplemental question should be included
- Actual word count and word count limit included
- What do you want the admission officer to know about you through reading your Common App essay/supplemental essay? What do you want to convey through the essay that isn't already in your application packet?

If you have questions or would like to discuss your essay in-person, please email her directly. We do ask that if you will share your essays with your assigned college counselor, please do not also ask Dr. Shere to review them. There is no need for multiple counselors to review your essays. This is also unfair to other students. Remember, we have over 800 seniors to serve. We hope you take advantage of this opportunity!



Environmental Club's Eco-Fact of the Week!

Wildfires are greatly damaging to our ecosystems, as they can destroy tree roots, the soil, animals, and their habitat. They produce a great amount of heat and release high amounts of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. Every year, about 5 million acres of land (77 acres per fire) are burned by wildfires, and among those wildfires, 85% were caused by humans. It takes up to 65 years for ecosystems to recover from wildfire damage! To prevent wildfires, avoid making campfires near flammable things; when the campfire is not in use, make sure the campfire is completely put out; keep cars off dry grass; and avoid creating sparks near any vegetation. **Help to preserve our resources and properly sort your trash!**
