Happy belated Veterans Day! To our Stuy families celebrating, Happy <u>Diwali!</u> As a reminder for students, Tuesday will be an extended <u>homeroom schedule</u> with special activity planned for all grades.

This week we have two special events. Tomorrow, the **Parent's Association Meeting will host a Presentation of all our Department Chairs/Assistant Principals**. They will present their course offerings and answer questions. If you have not registered yet, please make sure you do so to <u>get the link</u> to view the virtual meeting. We will begin at a **special time - 6pm!** There will be Mandarin and ASL interpretation.

Faculty and families will receive their **Fall Parent Teacher Conference** appointments tomorrow, 11/14. The conferences are remote via phone call on **November 16 (5:30-8pm) and November 17 (1-3pm)**. See below for more details. Students will be dismissed at 12:11pm on Friday. There is a schedule in this update.

In appreciation, the Parent's Association will host a faculty luncheon on Friday, 11/17 before the conferences. Students have created notes of appreciation for teachers that will decorate the lovely luncheon in the lobby. Anyone who would like to **donate a dessert** should see the instructions in this update to bring in treats by 9am on 11/17. We appreciate the dedication and hard work of our PA!

Beginning on November 27, we will be instituting **two-factor authentication (2FA)** on all systems for staff and students to increase security of accounts on our platforms. 2FA requires two forms of identification to verify

an account holder's identity and grant access to the account. Staff and students will be required to have 2FA on stuy.edu and Talos accounts. Additionally, staff will have 2FA on Jupiter grades. This mandate will add an additional layer of security by making it harder for attackers to gain access to online accounts. Detailed instructions will be provided.

Please note, there is no way to add conference appointments to teacher schedules once the deadline for requests passed (November 9 at 5pm) as advertised. Please remember this is not your only opportunity to speak to a teacher or counselor about your child.

Reminders from our previous instructions:

- Conferences with teachers are 5 minutes each or 8 minutes if interpretation is needed.
- Conferences with counselors are 10 minutes each or 12 minutes if interpretation is needed.
- Please be sure to carefully review the phone number in your email, which you entered on your request; as we cannot change it for you. If you made a mistake, you will have to contact teachers to update them.
- Be available on your appointment date to answer calls that say "unknown", "private" or "unlisted" as teachers may call from private phone numbers.
- **IMPORTANT:** You may not be scheduled for ALL your requests this is NOT an error. The number of teachers that parents will speak to is dependent upon the number of parents that sign up; how many teachers they are interested in speaking to; and the number of appointments that can be scheduled in the allotted time frame including translation time and counselor assignment, which extends conferences.
- Please do not contact teachers asking them to "add" you to their schedule. Teachers have calls scheduled for their full time frames.
- Changes cannot be made once appointments are distributed.
- If a teacher is absent on PTC, they will contact you to arrange a mutually agreeable alternate time to have the phone call; we cannot 'fill in' your schedule with more calls due to absences.

Students visit Central Synagogue for a talk by Holocaust survivor Sylvia Smoller

Sophomore, Junior, and Senior students along with Dr. Greenwald and Mr. Sandler attended a talk at Central Synagogue entitled *3448: A Holocaust Survivor on her Improbable Survival with* Central member and Holocaust survivor Sylvia Smoller who was one of the few lucky refugees to escape the clutches of the Nazi extermination machine through the decency of a Japanese consulate officer in Vilnius Lithuania. Her story is exceptional because the vast majority of Jews were not able to get out or find refuge in the United States. As time passes and fewer people are left to tell the story of the 20th century attempt to eradicate the Jewish people of the world this talk was an important opportunity.



Smoller spoke of the mathematical principle called the "butterfly effect" in which the flapping of a butterfly's wings on one side of the world can eventually produce a tornado in another. For Smoller's family it was the decency of one man, Chiune Sugihara who, against orders from his superiors, processed hundreds of visas to help the persecuted escape. Because of that, Smoller, as well as her son, were able to become doctors in the fields of epidemiology, genetics, and psychiatry advancing various medical fields and saving many lives.

Smoller highlighted the alarming increase in antisemitism around the world and called on everyone to perform "small decencies" so that they can become a part of one's character and stand up to the "small *in*decencies" to prevent larger ones from happening.

Bates is a highly selective small liberal arts college located about 40 minutes from Portland, Maine. Some highlights of a Bates experience include: being a campus that is 100% focused on undergraduate education, not having a Greek system with fraternities and sororities, meeting 100% of demonstrated financial need for all admitted students (this means it can be more affordable than SUNY for some families), and it is a school where all students complete a thesis or capstone project prior to graduation.




Dr. Greenwald's classes attend talk with Emily Bowen Cohen

We do ask that if you will share your essays with your assigned college counselor, please do not also ask Dr. Shere to review them. There is no need for multiple counselors to review your essays. This is also unfair to other students. Remember, we have over 800 seniors to serve.

Free SAT Prep for qualifying students from Brooklyn College Educational Talent Search Program





Your portfolio can include finished pieces,


work in progress, and sketchbooks.

Wildfires are greatly damaging to our ecosystems, as they can destroy tree roots, the soil, animals, and their habitat. They produce a great amount of heat and release high amounts of carbon dioxide into the atmosphere. Every year, about 5 million acres of land (77 acres per fire) are burned by wildfires, and among those wildfires, 85% were caused by humans. It takes up to 65 years for ecosystems to recover from wildfire damage! To prevent wildfires, avoid





making campfires near flammable things; when the campfire is not in use, make sure the campfire is completely put out; keep cars off dry grass; and avoid creating sparks near any vegetation.
