## SENIORS: Enter Early Results in Navance & HONOR E.D. AGREEMENTS!

Admissions results for students who have applied EA/ED/REA have been or will soon be released. Please remember to keep your college counselor informed regarding the decisions that you receive...whether that means sharing awesome news (admitted), bad news (denied), or something in between (deferred). We are here to guide and support you throughout this process, but, we can only do so when you are in communication with us. **Please enter your admissions results in Naviance once you get the chance.** You may enter these results by:



- clicking on the "EDIT" icon next to the college in your "colleges I'm bn applying to" list
- if you were accepted or denied, select the appropriate response from the drop -down menu under "Result"
- if you were waitlisted or deferred, select the appropriate response under "Result"
- click on "Save College Application"
- do this for each college for whom you have received an admissions decision

\*\*\*Students admitted to any college via Early Decision must remember that this is a binding agreement; you must withdraw any remaining applications and submit any required deposit by the deadline specified by the institution in question. You may not submit any new applications.

Financial aid applicants who receive a financial aid offer that makes attendance impossible should contact the college (and your assigned college counselor) right away. \*\*\*

If you applied ED somewhere and were not admitted, you are now free to pursue another college through EDII, if you wish.

Students admitted to any college via EA or REA are still free to pursue other post-secondary options should they need to do so. EA and REA are non-binding. These students are not required to submit a deposit prior to any deadline earlier than May 1.

# SENIORS: Change your email in your Common App ....

You may recall from our junior year presentations for students and parents last winter that we advised students against using their <u>stuy.edu</u> email addresses with their college applications. This was because in recent years some colleges have not been able to successfully email students at these addresses, an issue Google has never rectified.



Unfortunately, we have learned that this issue has resurfaced this fall. **Some college emails are not reaching students at their <u>stuy.edu</u> addresses**, from multiple colleges, including Northeastern University, Binghamton University, and University at Albany.

Students who used their <u>stuy.edu</u> address in Common App or any other college application please take note:

If you do not receive an email from any college with your applicant portal and login credentials within 1-3 days of submitting your application (check your junk.spam folder too), make sure to contact that college and ask them to change your contact information to a different email address.

Contact your assigned college counselor if you have questions or need assistance.

- 1. Each application is scored with weighted consideration given to completeness, quality of responses and overall appearance. Points will be applied or deducted accordingly.
- 2. All parts of the application must be completed, and all requested documents submitted by the deadline. Incomplete and late applications will not be considered.
- 3. The essay is a critical part of the application consideration. The directions must be followed exactly with respect to subject matter, length, grammatical correctness and spacing.
- 4. Letter of recommendation must be specific to this scholarship and not a generic referral.
- 5. The photograph should be a quality image. If the scholarship is awarded, the photograph will be used in printed publications.

And, if the student is invited for an interview as part of the Youth Achiever application process, the student should be advised to dress appropriately for the occasion.

#### SENIORS: IMPORTANT: COLLEGE APPS AND WINTER BREAK!

Seniors: Remember that school will be closed over the break, so our staff will not be available to respond to emails during that time. Use these next two weeks wisely; if you want help with finalizing your RD list, your Common App, financial aid apps, or anything else before the break, make sure to make an appointment with your assigned college counselor using the links already provided to you earlier this fall.



Also, remember that Dr. Shere is available to help *any* senior in *any* caseload: cshere@stuy.edu You can also drop in to see a college counselor during our open  $q \mathcal{E}$  a periods: 1st period, 5th period, 9th period, 1oth period, and often after school until 4:00.

We thought it might ease your mind to remind you that school documents can be submitted after RD deadlines as needed. This includes things like transcripts, rec letters, fee waivers, counselor signing of ED II agreements etc. So, if you notice something was not submitted for your RD colleges before break, or, if you add colleges to your list or apply ED II somewhere during the vacation, don't worry. We will begin to submit any outstanding documents, approve fee waivers/ED II agreements, etc., as soon as school reopens on January 2. Again, this is perfectly acceptable for colleges and universities with early January deadlines; deadlines are for student application submission, not document submission by high schools.

Just make sure that all of your RD applications are listed in your "colleges I'm applying to" list in Naviance by the time we get back to school on January 2.

Lastly, for those students who made specific, rather than general, teacher recommendation requests in Naviance, remember that you will need to make additional specific requests for each college you add to your "colleges I'm applying to" list in Naviance. Otherwise, these recs cannot be submitted. If you don't remember how to make these requests, see the instructions in the Document Resources section of your Naviance account in the College Office folder. Make sure to check this over your vacation. And please make sure to take some time for yourself over the break...you have earned that!
