As indicated via emails last week, Our telephone system issue has been more extensive than originally anticipated by the technicians who have been working to repair it. Although a new controller was installed and restored some of the functionality of some phones, the technicians discovered defective switches likely damaged due to the citywide electrical power surge that occurred in December. Consequently, our telephone system continues to be under repair with expedited technician dispatch. Unfortunately, we have not been given a timeline for full functionality of the telephones. Therefore, if you are trying to contact the school, please rely on email communication until further notice. We will update you during the week as we get further notification of the progress of the repairs.

This month will conclude the Fall semester with the marking period ending on January 22. In-class final exams will take place this week. Teachers have informed students of any in-class final exams that are scheduled. Last Friday, students and parents received via email their scheduled regents/finals. Another email will follow up this week detailing room assignments and specific instructions. Please make sure to read it

carefully. You may [refer to the UPDATED schedule at this link.](#) **Please note:** Students attend school during January 23-26 *only* if they are scheduled to take an exam. Students may not be in the building during that week if they are not taking an exam unless they are escorted in and out of the building and supervised by a staff member (i.e by appointment).

The Spring 2024 term will begin on January 30. Students will be able to view their Spring program schedules on their Talos accounts on January 23. Please read the information and timeline on Program Change Requests in this update.

Additionally, the **CR (credit) option** will once again be available for Fall Term 2023. **Important for Senior Families:** If you are considering changing a final grade in any/all courses for Fall Term 2023 to CR in time to be reflected on mid-year reports to colleges, there will be a very quick turnaround time for submission. Grades will be made available to senior families for review with specific instructions to be provided via email. Grades 9-11 will receive information on the CR option once report cards are distributed after the start of the Spring semester.

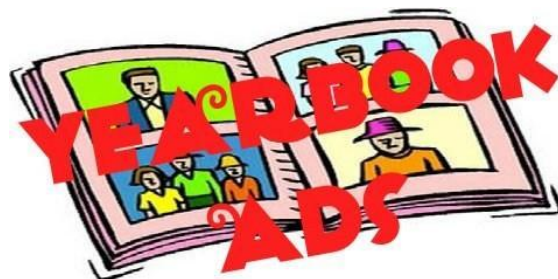

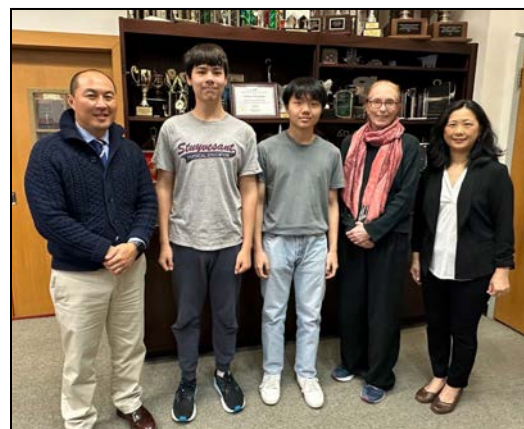

This is an amazing accomplishment and we are so proud of them! Congratulations as well to Mr. Jason Econome, their Research teacher! Aiden's project was on Assessing the Accuracy of a Generative Model for Creating Novel Spider Silk Proteins.

Samuel's project was on Turning Fat to Muscle by Activating Muscle-Specific Genes
Each student who is named a scholar receives \$2,000 and each school receives \$2,000 as well.

Throughout its history, the competition's alumni have been honored with 13 Nobel Prizes, 11 National Medals of Science, six Breakthrough Prizes, 21 MacArthur Foundation Fellowships



and two Fields Medals. This year, the Science Talent Search received more applicants than have been seen in over five decades.

Dr. Greenwald's class share Antebellum projects

Dr. Lisa Greenwald's AP U.S. History class is sharing their projects which are on display in the library. The creative and interesting assignment was:

"You are in the process of cleaning out the attic of a recently deceased relative from Connecticut. The house has been in the family for generations but finally it must be sold. It is yeoman's work cleaning out the dust of ages. You are up in the far reaches of the attic, bringing out grimy oil lamps, old Christmas ornaments, moth-eaten rugs and the like when you uncover a large wooden box that looks like it has not been touched for decades. You open it up and dig through the musty rags that fill most of it but your hand hits what feels like a large book and you draw it up into your lap. What you discover is the treasure of a lifetime. It is a scrap book of a distant relative who, as the family lore goes, was something of an amateur historian in his day. In the middle of the nineteenth century, he taught history and geography at the local boys' college nearby and developed a local reputation as a scholarly man with political foresight. Your scrap book contains everything from articles clipped from the local newspaper regarding the major events of the decade before the Civil War to maps, pictures, and recipes to "put by" the produce of his successful back yard garden and orchard. He treated everything from scholarly articles (which he includes) to local news with equal care and annotation as all of his entries have his (hand written) commentary and scribbles in the margins or on the back. "

Reminder: How to apply for Financial Aid

Below is a reminder about the basic steps for applying for financial aid in case you have not already done so. *Always consult the financial aid pages of the colleges to which you'll apply* for more details, and to make sure you meet each college's financial aid deadline. Make sure to also review the webinar slides and financial aid highlights pdfs shared with you back in early October through the Document Resources section of your Naviance account.



If you are looking for external scholarships, revisit the email sent to you from our office on September 18 and read the Stuy weekly updates throughout the rest of the school year

BASIC STEPS AND LINKS TO APPLY FOR FINANCIAL AID

-Gather important documents (Federal Tax Return form 1040, W2s, bank statements, etc.), student and parent social security numbers, and alien registration # (if applicable)

-Complete Collegeboard's **2024-2025 CSS Profile** (only if applicable) at www.collegeboard.org. If you completed this already for any EA/ED colleges, remember to add any of your RD colleges before their respective financial aid deadlines. View which colleges require the CSS through the links below:

-Upload any required financial documents for CSS Profile colleges via **IDOC** or the method articulated by the colleges to which you're applying if requested. Always check your email and college portals and follow directions for sharing your tax documents.

- if applicable, complete any required institutional financial aid forms (Princeton, UPenn, etc.)

-Get your **FSA IDs** (one for a parent, **AND** one for the student) so you can file the FAFSA

-Complete the **2024-2025 FAFSA**. Keep in mind that [this form is different](#) than in the past. And, [processing delays and limited functionality have been commonplace](#) since the soft-launch of the form at the end of

December. But, the form should improve as the weeks progress, so try to complete the FAFSA as soon as is feasible. If it isn't working, try back again in a few days. **Contributing parents must look for an email from FAFSA and complete their portion of their child's FAFSA within 45 days or the student's FAFSA will be deleted**

- **if financially eligible**, apply for New York State's TAP. TAP is now a stand-alone application; you need not have completed your FAFSA to apply to TAP: [NYS Student Aid Payment Application](#)

Please also refer to this [comprehensive guide](#) for more financial aid information and other useful resources

Please note that a small number of our students may be ineligible to file the FAFSA due to their immigration status. However, these students can still file the CSS Profile, and, can qualify for NY state aid like TAP and Excelsior through the **The New York State Dream Act. These awards can be worth over \$5000 per year in grant aid. Students can apply here: <https://www.hesc.ny.gov/dream/>

-Once you know where you are going to college (that may well not be until May, and that's fine), log in to your account at www.hesc.ny.gov and **make sure that your TAP application reflects the school that you will attend in the fall (NY State only)**. You may also use this site to apply for [the New York State Excelsior](#) Scholarship in the spring of 2024

Eco-Fact of the Week from Stuy's Environmental Club!

Water is a finite resource, about 70% of the Earth is covered in water, and about 3% of water is freshwater. Of that, only about 1.2% is drinkable. Using water-saving techniques can divert less water from our rivers, bays, and estuaries, which helps keep the environment healthy. Toilets use about 30% of the total water used in a household. Therefore, we can put 2 inches of sand or pebbles in the bottom of a one-liter plastic bottle, fill the rest of the bottle with water, and put it in your toilet tank. In an average home, the bottle may save five gallons or more of water every day, and it does not harm the efficiency of the toilet. Please **help to preserve our resources and properly sort your trash!**

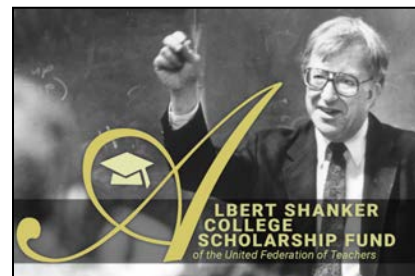

Apply for the Albert Shanker Scholarship before 2/28/24- worth \$5K!

The UFT Albert Shanker Scholarship is a scholarship worth \$5000 for graduating seniors in NYC public schools. There are strict financial eligibility requirements for the scholarship but, otherwise, this is an accessible scholarship for eligible students.

High school seniors have only a few weeks left to apply for the Albert Shanker Scholarship. The process is easier than ever with our new online portal.

Candidates must be financially eligible and be accepted in a full-time, matriculated, degree-granting program at an accredited college or university. **The deadline to apply for a \$5,000 scholarship is Wednesday, Feb. 28.**



LAST CHANCE! JUNIORS: Apply for the Coolidge Scholarship by 1/18/2024

The [2023-24 Coolidge Scholarship application](#) is now live. **The Coolidge Scholarship is a full-ride, four-year, merit scholarship that recipients may use for undergraduate study at any accredited college or university in the United States.** Any high school junior who plans to enroll in college in the fall of 2025 and is an American citizen or legal permanent resident is eligible to apply (current high school seniors are not eligible to apply). Winners may use the scholarship to pursue any academic major.

Academic excellence is the primary criterion considered by the Coolidge Scholarship. Secondary criteria include an interest in public policy and an appreciation of the values President Coolidge championed. Successful candidates will also demonstrate humility and have a record of genuine service to their communities. A complete description of the scholarship's criteria is available [here](#).

Please know that the application requires that candidates read President Coolidge's *Autobiography* and a few other reading assignments, and then write three essays. We therefore encourage students to begin the application early. Candidates who begin the application at the last minute are unlikely to be successful. **The submission deadline is 5:00 PM Pacific time, Thursday, January 18, 2024.**

[The Scholarship Plus](#) program is a scholarship and community for New York City students who have demonstrated academic achievement in the face of obstacles. Scholarship Plus offers such students a competitive four-year scholarship PLUS individualized, wraparound support.

We celebrate students' successes and help them navigate difficult moments. The scholarship may be used to pay tuition, room and board, fees, and other educational expenses. Each scholarship will be renewable annually for up to four years of study as long as the student maintains a good academic record and makes standard progress toward a degree.

ELIGIBILITY

- Applicants must be current high school seniors who attend public, parochial, or private schools in New York City, and have demonstrated:
- GPA of 84.5% or higher
- Significant financial need (family income less than \$52,000)
- Willingness to engage with the Scholarship Plus community in events, workshops, and semester check-ins

**Preference will be given to students whose parents have not graduated from American four-year colleges or universities.*

**Applicants must be citizens or permanent residents of the United States.*

JUNIORS: Free After School Opportunity for Students Interested in Physics and Music

In March 2024, Dr. Stephon Alexander of Brown University will launch Sound+Science at the new Civic Hall space in Union Square. Sound+Science is a groundbreaking educational program aimed at inspiring exceptional students to explore the intersection of physics, coding, math and music. Based on Dr. Alexander's book *The Jazz of Physics*, participants will explore modules like *The Hidden Codes in Electronic Music*, *From Hip-Hop to AI*, and *Music Improvisation and the Evolution of the Mathematics of Computation* revealing the profound connections between music, coding, physics and mathematics.

Underwritten by the Simons Foundation, Sound+Science will be offered free to New York City public high school students in their junior year. Students interested in attending the program, which runs on Tuesdays
