There are many excellent opportunities in this issue - including several highlighted below.

ACADEMICS: Many colleges offer spring and summer **precollege classes** for high school students – a variety of these may be found in this section. Financial aid often may be available for eligible students. And (check the EVENTS section) there is an open-to-all **virtual pre-college fair on Saturday, January 20th**! There are still a few free **CUNY College Now spring term courses** available to juniors & seniors, and, with City Tech in Brooklyn, for sophomores as well. – deadlines are approaching!

BUSINESS/CAREERS: Two excellent programs that connect students to business/job opportunities for the summer are now accepting applications. **Ladders for Leaders** is for students 16 and older – the application deadline is **January 21st**! **Futures & Options** also connects older students with paid summer business internships, as well as offering the **Career Essentials** option for younger students. The **Leadership in Financial Education** offers six spring workshops on a variety of topics, including internships – it is open to current juniors & seniors.

LEADERSHIP/GOVERNMENT: For Brooklyn students interested in law, the **Brooklyn District Attorney's office** welcomes applications from current 11th and 12th graders for their February and April one-week school break programs, with stipends and metrocards available. The application deadline is **January 31st**. And the **Manhattan D.A.** is now accepting applications for their paid summer internship; 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students may apply. 2. Explore Engineering Innovation (EEI)

“During the course, students complete activities in civil, chemical, electrical/computer, mechanical engineering, and materials science. By applying knowledge of math and science to labs and hands-on projects, the concepts learned in high school classrooms are linked to real-world practice. Additionally, students’ confidence grows as they attend college-level lectures, solve problems, test theories, and ultimately learn to think like engineers.”

3. Sustainable Energy Engineering (SEE)

“How can we design and implement new sustainable energy technologies that are resilient and economical, and that may be incorporated into the existing power grid?

To answer these questions, we need to take a deep look the ways we currently use energy so that we may find ways to reduce our use, and we must study the science and engineering concepts behind our current methods of energy production and distribution, as well as the impact of policy on our ability to make change. This course will introduce students to these topics, giving them the fundamental knowledge necessary to understand the challenges and opportunities in sustainable energy engineering, and to decide whether this is a field they want to pursue.”
