Stuyvesant High School Weekly Update

The Spring 2024 term will begin tomorrow, January 30. There will be a homeroom schedule and MetroCards will be distributed. Please note that since current MetroCards expire on 1/29; students may need to pay for their ride to school on Tuesday and should plan accordingly. The Spring PE rotation schedule is available at [this link](#). Students can view what room their PE class is in throughout the term by bookmarking this link, which can be found at www.stuy.edu under the 'Athletics' tab.

Beginning with the start of the Spring term on January 30, there will be a 20-page per day print job limit for each student login with their stuy.edu email address. Impacted print stations are on the 2nd floor outside room 209, in the Student Union in room 260, and in the Library. The 20-page print limit for students is due to increased digital submissions, constraints in budget, and minimizing paper waste

Program change requests ended at 10am today for all grades. [Instructions](#) were emailed to students and families last week. Department chairs and counselors began reviewing all requests today for approvals and denials. All communication should be kept within Talos by students.

Additionally, grades for seniors only were made visible on Talos at noon today. The **CR (credit) option** will once again be available for Fall Term 2023. If you are considering changing a final grade in any/all courses for Fall Term 2023 to CR in time to be reflected on mid-year reports to colleges, there will be a very quick turnaround time for submission. CR Requests for senior grades to be reflected on reports to colleges must

be submitted by February 2 by noon. See the instructions below for more details. Grades 9–11 will receive information on the CR option once report cards are distributed on February 6.

This week, we begin our annual celebration of Black History Month! There will be a virtual parent ‘breakfast’ on the morning of February 15 for BIPOC parents and guardians at 9am. Registration details are in this update. That evening, join Stuyvesant’s Black History Month celebration in the cafeteria at 4pm. There will be more details to come as well as a registration link.

SENIORS: CR Requests for Fall 2023 Term – deadline 2/2/24 @12pm

Senior families should begin to review Fall Term 2023 grades using parent [Talos](#) accounts as well as parent NYC Schools Accounts at mystudent.nyc beginning at 12:00 pm on Monday, January 29, 2024. We will post grades to [Talos](#) under “Grades” and “MP3” for seniors. Please ensure you toggle on your [Talos](#) account in the right upper corner (computers, not mobile devices) to 2023–2024 Term 1. These



mid-year grades are included in transcripts that are sent to colleges and universities; therefore, any updates to transcripts must be done immediately.

Parents/guardians may choose to have any numerical passing grade of **65 or higher** updated to a passing grade of “credit” (CR). Grades of “CR” will not be factored into students’ GPAs. If this is the choice you and your child make, you must communicate this request through your **parent** Talos account on talos.stuy.edu. Parents may choose the "CR" option for all courses with a passing grade or for specific courses with a passing grade. You have the right to discuss these options with school staff.

If you are interested in requesting any passing grade of 65 or higher converted to “CR”, these requests must be **submitted no later than Friday, February 2, 2023 at 12:00pm** via **parent** Talos accounts.

Instructions:

- Ensure you are in “2023–2024 Term 1” in upper right corner
- Click “CR List” on the left side bar of your account and then click “create” to select the grades you want to “CR”.
- Click the “+” button and choose your student in the drop down menu
- Select the course in the drop down menu
- Click CREATE

The program office will process the request. The “CR” will appear on your NYC Schools Account by **February 5, 2024**. You will not see the change on Talos.

Any parent who needs assistance accessing their Talos account should contact Ms. Ingram at ringram3@schools.nyc.gov. Parents who need assistance with their NYC Schools Account should reach out to Ms. Tang at ntang5@schools.nyc.gov. Students who are over the age of 18 may request access to the “CR” function on their Talos account by contacting Ms. Ingram.

Please note, the transcript is a record of all the classes a student is enrolled in over their high school career; this includes classes taken over the summer. A change to “CR” if requested will be reflected in the final grade on the transcript.

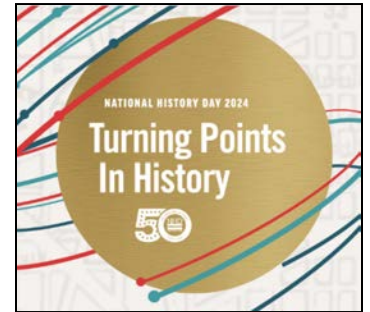

This past weekend, some class of 2024 seniors and/or their families received an email from Herff Jones, the publisher of the yearbook, offering them the opportunity to purchase a yearbook. Through a miscommunication on the part of the company, the appearance was that this email was from Stuyvesant High School. While the email was not from the school, it was legitimate and they obtained those email addresses from sales of yearbook ads. The link in the email is also legitimate. There were no phishing or scam links associated with that email. If you purchased a yearbook through that link; it was a legitimate purchase of a Stuyvesant Class of 2024 yearbook. If you received that email, you will also receive an email from Herff Jones today clarifying this information.



There is no February 1 deadline to purchase a yearbook. We will advise you of a deadline soon. If there is financial hardship, please reach out directly to Ms. Ingram at ringram3@schools.nyc.gov to discuss.

Important Naviance Surveys for JUNIORS and Junior Parents!

There are two important surveys in Naviance juniors will need to complete in order to be ready for the meeting with your Stuy college counselor. You'll receive an email directly from your assigned college counselor by early February regarding how to schedule that meeting...stay tuned.



The SSR Survey: this is a lengthy survey that will be used by your *school counselor (guidance counselor)* to help conduct your SSR meeting and to provide essential background information for your counselor recommendation letter for college. Also, your *college counselor* will read your SSR survey in advance of your college planning meeting so that we are prepared to provide you with more specific guidance. **This survey must be completed in advance of your SSR meeting AND your college planning meeting.**

The College Planning Survey: this is a shorter survey that helps your assigned college counselor get a better sense of your college preferences so far. It is okay if you are uncertain or confused, or, if your preferences change in the coming months. This survey is just a starting point. **The College Planning Survey must be completed in advance of your meeting with your assigned college counselor.**

We suggest having BOTH surveys complete by the end of January.

You'll find the surveys in your **student Naviance accounts** (NOT parent accounts). Click on the blue circle with your initials in the upper right corner of the opening screen once logged in to your Naviance account. Then, look for **Surveys** and click "**Surveys from your school**".

You do not need to complete either survey in one sitting. Just make sure to **save frequently as you go along** until you are finished.

Parents may find their survey on their Naviance account by clicking their initials on the upper right corner and then clicking "Surveys From Your School". You will see the "Parent SSR Survey" there to fill out. Please fill it out before your family meeting with your college counselor!

Congratulations to Stuy's Mathematical Modelers!

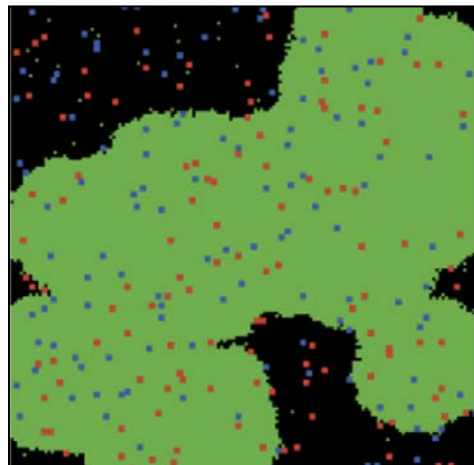
Two teams from Stuyvesant earned the “Meritorious” designation in the 2023 High School Mathematical Contest in Modeling (HiMCM), run by the Consortium for Mathematics and its Applications (COMAP)! Their submissions were rated in the top 20% of competitors worldwide, and now the teams will move on to the 2024 International Mathematical Modeling Challenge (IM2C).

The team of Ethan Sharma, Ryan Park, Ethan Sie, and Jackie Zeng put together an impressive analysis of how dandelion spores spread and built a mathematical model to quantify the impact of invasive species on native environments.

The team of Christopher Louie, Jack Cheng, Andy Huang, and Jaco Xia performed a cost-benefit analysis of transitioning large urban areas to all-electric bus fleets, and modeled the resulting impact on global warming.

Congratulations also to the team of Sascha Gordon-Zolov, Astrid Harrington, Filippas Kogiantis, and Mina Yeh for earning an **Honorable Mention** for their work as well!

Program Dates: July 8 – August 2, 2024

Students can major in dance, theater, instrumental music, orchestral strings, vocal music, film, or visual arts. The program is designed for students at an intermediate or advanced level of study in their discipline. The daily schedule includes studio work and experiences with professional artists. In the studios, students develop and improve their technical skills and creative expression in their art form. Time is dedicated to rehearsals, attending professional performances, visiting arts venues and exploring careers. The Institute culminates with an exhibition and performance showcasing the students' work.

Admission to the Summer Arts Institute is by application and audition. Students may apply and audition for only ONE studio.
