This week at Stuyvesant, students will celebrate Valentine's Day with a Bake Sale by the Robotics Team today and flower deliveries in homerooms on Tuesday. We will also continue our celebration of Black History Month by hosting two events on Thursday, February 15. The NYC DOE is launching the 2024 NYC School Survey today. We will be emailing detailed instructions to parents and guardians on how to participate in this important annual survey. We appreciate your participation in this survey. Weekly reminders will be emailed to families until the deadline on April 5. While the survey is not anonymous, it is confidential and your answers are not seen at the school or DOE level. Only aggregated data is shared annually. You can view the 2023 results here. We are happy to announce that the **Commencement Ceremony for the Class of 2024** will take place on Thursday, June 20 at 11am at the United Palace Theater. We will be sending out a detailed letter with information on senior activities for the spring later today to all students and parents. We are so excited to celebrate the accomplishments of our students with you!

We plan to administer the in school **SAT** and **PSAT 10** exams in mid/late March and/or April most likely during a school day. We will have separate test sessions for these examinations. The College Board has transitioned to a digital version for both the SAT and the PSAT 10; therefore, it requires the school to plan and prepare differently to administer the exam to over 1,600 juniors and sophomores. We have not finalized the dates for the administration of the SAT and PSAT 10 as we are awaiting a decision from the College Board for a possible flexibility for the testing window dates. We will send an update to juniors and sophomores this week with more details.

To add to our school guidelines, the Student Union collaborated with the administration to create **Dining Guidelines** for the student cafeteria. Please review them at <u>this link</u>. This Update contains information for many upcoming summer opportunities and scholarships as well as the extensive Opportunities Bulletin released weekly by Mr. Harvey Blumm. As a reminder, please allow for two weeks when requesting **Teacher and Counselor recommendations** for programs. We kindly stress the importance of planning ahead when requesting to give ample time for these thoughtful recommendations to be written.

2024 NYC School Survey Begins on 2/12/2024!

The 2024 NYC School Survey begins on Monday February 12! Parents and guardians will receive detailed instructions via email. Students will fill out their survey in Homeroom on March 5. Staff members will also fill out a survey during faculty conferences in March.

Every year, The Department of Education asks all families of students in grades 3-K through 12, to take the NYC School Survey. The survey gives school leaders a better understanding of what members of their school community think about their school. The information collected by the survey is designed to support a dialogue among all members of the school community about how to make the school a better place to learn.

The deadline to submit the 2024 NYC School Survey is April 5, 2024

Families can access the 2023 NYC School Survey <u>online</u> in 10 languages at <u>nycschoolsurvey.org</u> or by logging into their <u>NYC Schools Account (NYCS</u>) Parents **must** enter a "f" in front of the student ID number to access parent/guardian questions. One survey for every child attending Stuyvesant will be filled out.

Please note: There is one parent survey per student. Once one parent/guardian fills out the survey; the other parent(s) cannot use the code again. This is not in the control of Stuyvesant. The DOE provides one parent survey per student. We suggest you coordinate your responses.

Notification: 2024 Lead Testing at Stuyvesant

In accordance with State law, all schools must test for lead in water every three years. In 2023, the Department of Education (DOE) began a new testing cycle, which will conclude in December 2025. In the second phase of this testing cycle, a third of buildings will be tested.

Stuyvesant's school building has been selected to be a part of the 2024 cohort. The letter linked below will provide additional details surrounding the DOE's lead testing protocols and procedures.

Once the building has been tested and the lab results received, the principal will receive a notification of the results. In any building where test results show even one water outlet above the action level, the DOE will implement its standard response protocol.

Families and staff should rest assured that New York City drinking water is safe and of the highest quality in the world. New York City's water meets or exceeds all Federal and State standards. In addition, the DOE works with other City agencies to ensure there is safe drinking water in schools. The safety and well-being of students and staff is our highest priority.

PA General Meeting 2/13/2024: Focus on Mental Health Awareness

Stressed about tests, papers, tryouts, college apps, work and extracurricular activities and feeling overwhelmed?

Stressed about work, health, family responsibilities, world affairs, and sometimes unsure of how to approach parenting when your child is anxious? Looking for practical tips and suggestions to manage stress and anxiety?

If so, please join the Parents' Association General Meeting at 7 pm on Tuesday, February 13, 2024

Assistant Principal **Ms. Casey Pedrick** will start the informational session with an overview of the resources available to students at Stuy. Then she will be joined by clinical psychologists **Dr. Terri Bacow, Dr. Doris Chang and Dr. Jonathan Kaplan** for a presentation and Q&A. Drawing from their expertise, they will offer suggestions on overcoming anxiety and stress for teenagers and their parents. **Dr. Terri Bacow** is a widely known expert in cognitive behavioral therapy, an evidence-based therapy approach. A Brown and Boston University graduate, she sees clients in her private practice on the Upper West Side where she specializes in treating anxiety and mood disorders. She's the author of *Goodbye, Anxiety: A Guided Journal for Overcoming Worry*.

Dr. Doris Chang is a licensed clinical psychologist and Associate Professor in the NYU Silver School of Social Work. She completed her doctoral training at UCLA and postdoctoral training at the Department of Social Medicine, Harvard Medical School. Her research seeks to advance the well-being of racial and ethnic communities with a focus on Asian Americans.





As a clinical psychologist, Dr. Jonathan Kaplan serves as the Director of the SoHo

<u>CBT + Mindfulness Center</u>. For over 25 years, he's provided cognitive behavioral therapy (CBT), Acceptance and Commitment Therapy (ACT), and mindfulness-based interventions. He has written books on mindfulness and led workshops at K-12 schools throughout NYC. He also is the proud parent of a junior at Stuy.

Families: National Student Clearinghouse (NSC) Opt Out; deadline 2/16/24

Assistant Principal, Ms. Casey Pedrick shares this important announcement for all families:

The DOE regularly requests data from the National Student Clearinghouse (NSC), which has a database of college enrollment and degree information for more than 3,600 colleges and universities. To access this data, the DOE

submits each student's name, grade level, and date of birth to NSC so that they can match the students' college information. As in previous years, families have the right to request that their child's name, grade level, and date of birth not be shared with the NSC. **Families who do not want their child's information released to the NSC must complete the opt-out form and return it by February 16, 2024.** Download this form and send back with your child to room 222 or email to Ms. Pedrick at cpedrick@schools.nyc.gov ONLY if you wish to opt out.





However, it has been found that in the past 3 weeks leading up to February 14th, 360,000 metric tons of carbon emissions were released due to the transportation of flowers. Since most flowers purchased on Valentine's Day are out of season in the US during the month. they must be shipped in over long distances, usually from South American countries with climates ideal for flower-growing. IDNYC Applications for High School Students

High School students can find information on IDNYC applications at these links! Launched in 2015, IDNYC is a card for all New Yorkers, regardless of immigration status. The free, municipal identification card provides access to a wide variety of services and programs offered by the City. For cardholders age 16 and older, cards are valid for five years from the date











the application was approved. For cardholders under the age of 16, cards are valid for two years from the date the application was approved.

To acquire an ID, high school students can make an appointment through the <u>IDNYC online portal</u> or can visit a site accepting walk-in applicants. For additional information on IDNYC including a FAQ, review the <u>IDNYC online portal</u>.

The National CCAA First-Year Scholarship Application; deadline 4/1/24

The <u>National CCAA First-Year Scholarship</u> is awarded to 16 randomly selected students from various geographic regions who attend one of our 116 <u>member</u> <u>institutions</u> in fall 2024. The scholarship was established to celebrate and promote Catholic higher education, and <u>the National CCAA Board of Directors</u> is pleased to help support students' transition to college.

The scholarship is a one-time, \$1,000 award. This year's application is available <u>here</u>; it is brief and should only take students a few minutes to complete. The

Yankees-Stonewall Scholarship Opportunity; deadline 4/5/24

NYC Public Schools, in partnership with the Stonewall Inn and the New York Yankees, are partnering for the 6th Annual Yankee-Stonewall Scholarship Initiative. This one-time scholarship of \$10,000 will be awarded to a NYCPS high school student from each borough. The five recipients will be announced in Spring 2024.

Scholarship Eligibility Criteria:

- A current Senior in high school
- Intending to attend a two-year or four-year college
- A member of the lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, Queer or Questioning (LGBTQ+) community or someone who has contributed significantly to the LGBTQ+ community
- At least a 2.5 GPA


Latino College Expo & Leadership Summit 3/16/24

More than 60% of unused P-EBT funds that were issued to families last May will begin to expire in February. Whenever families use the benefits, the timeline will reset and they will have another 274 days before the funds are at risk of expiration. Families who have lost their P-EBT card can get a replacement by calling 1-888-328-6399.
