### SLT Meeting - February 27, 2024 @3:45pm



### Fill out your 2024 NYC School Survey

Parents and guardians received detailed instructions via email. Students will fill out their survey in Homeroom on March 5. Staff members will also fill out a survey during faculty conferences in March.

Every year, The Department of Education asks all families of students in grades 3-K through 12, to take the NYC School Survey. The survey gives school leaders a better understanding of what members of their school community think about their school. The information collected by the survey is designed to support a dialogue among all members of the school community about how to make the school a better place to learn.

The deadline to submit the 2024 NYC School Survey is April 5, 2024

Families can access the 2023 NYC School Survey <u>online</u> in 10 languages at <u>nycschoolsurvey.org</u> or by logging into their <u>NYC Schools Account (NYCS</u>) Parents **must** enter a "f" in front of the student ID number to access parent/guardian questions. One survey for every child attending Stuyvesant will be filled out.

Please note: There is one parent survey per student. Once one parent/guardian fills out the survey; the other parent(s) cannot use the code again. This is not in the control of Stuyvesant. The DOE provides one parent survey per student. We suggest you coordinate your responses.

### Notice to Juniors: School Day SAT 2024

### Juniors (Class of 2025)

We will administer the in school digital SAT to all Juniors on two separate dates in March and April. With the transition to a digital version for the SAT, we can only test half of the cohort per test date to ensure we have adequate hardware, bandwidth, and personnel for a successful administration. The two administration dates are below:

- March 22, 2024: 9:00 AM 12:00 PM
- April 19, 2024: 9:00 AM 12:00 PM







We will randomly assign students to one of the two dates for the in school SAT. We will not take preference requests so please be prepared for either of the two dates when you are assigned. We will send you weekly notifications as we solidify details of your assigned test date and the necessary resources you will need on test day.

Stuyvesant will automatically register all Juniors to take the exam and there is no cost to students/families for this in school SAT administration. Please note, students are not required to take the exam, and no notification is necessary to the school if you decide to *not* take the exam during this in school administration. In preparation for the digital version of the SAT, we recommend that you familiarize yourself with what to expect and to practice this new version of the exam. We recommend you read the <u>Spring 2024 SAT School</u> <u>Day Student Guide</u> and visit the College Board site for more information about the SAT. Stuyvesant has provided you with SAT prep software to support your preparation at PrepScholar. <u>PrepScholar</u> provides self-paced adaptive test prep focused on more than 100 skill lessons and 7,100+ practice questions with explanations. You received an email in the Fall to your *stuy.edu* account for this test prep opportunity – you can reset your password by clicking on <u>Reset Your Password / Log In</u>. We encourage you to start using the platform immediately to become more familiar with the digital version of the SAT.

### Notice to Sophomores: School Day PSAT Spring 2024

Sophomores (Class of 2026)

We will administer the in school digital PSAT10 to all Sophomores on **Saturday, April 13, 2024**, during two separate windows (morning and afternoon sessions). Stuyvesant will automatically register all Sophomores to take the exam and there is no cost to students/families for this PSAT10 administration.

With the transition to a digital version for the PSAT10 we can only test half of the cohort per test window to ensure we have adequate hardware,

bandwidth, and personnel for a successful administration. We will have two sessions on **Saturday**, April 13, 2024:

- Morning Window: 9:00 AM 12:00 PM
- Afternoon Window: 12:30 PM 3:00 PM




We will randomly assign students to one of the two windows, so if you plan on taking the PSAT10 through the school, then we ask that you hold the **4/13/24** date. We will not take preference requests, so please be prepared for either of the two windows when you are assigned. We will send you weekly notifications as we solidify details of your assigned test window and the necessary resources you will need on test day. In preparation for the digital version of the PSAT 10, we recommend that you familiarize yourself with what to expect and to practice this new version of the exam. ### Spring 2024 AP Exam Registration ends on 3/8/2024

The College Board Advanced Placement (AP) exams will be administered in **May 2024** as indicated on the <u>Stuyvesant High School AP Exam</u> <u>Schedule</u>. Please review the information below to determine if/what action steps you may need to take.

## Regular Fall Registration for AP Exams ended in November 2023 for full year AP courses and Fall Term only AP courses.



Stuyvesant High School's final deadline (**no exceptions**) to complete

registration for all AP examinations is **Friday**, **March 8**, **2024**. Please review the following to determine if the situation applies to you:

- Spring 2024 Single Term (One Semester) Classes
- Only applies to students who are currently enrolled in Spring Term 2024 single term AP classes AP Gov't & Politics (Spring Term Only), AP Physics 2, AP Physics C E&M, AP Comparative Gov't, and AP Microeconomics can register for the corresponding exams at <u>My AP</u> by obtaining the College Board Join Code from their AP teacher.
- Deadline is March 8, 2024
- AP Exam Late Registration
- Only applies to students who want to register for an AP examination *corresponding to a* full year AP course or (Fall Term only AP course).
- Students must complete the <u>AP Exam Late</u> <u>Registration Form</u>
- The fee for late registration is **\$40** (this fee applies to *all students)* in addition to the **\$98** Exam fee (unless qualified for no-fee AP exams for economic hardship).

### Deadline is Friday, Marcy 8, 2024.

### AP Exam Deregistration

Students who have already registered for an AP examination, but have decided to NOT take the exam, should deregister. The fee for canceling an exam a student registered for in November 2022 is \$40 per exam. This applies even to students qualifying for or no-fee AP exams for economic hardship. Complete the <u>AP Exam</u> <u>Deregistration Form</u> to deregister from an exam. After you deregister, the Stuyvesant AP Coordinator will finalize the deregistration process. Please note, if you submit payment for an AP exam and decide to

deregister or do not take the AP exam, then refunds for the cost of the exam (excluding \$40 fee) will be issued.

### **AP Exams Payment**

• Families are to make payment through the <u>Advanced Placement Examination Payment Portal</u>. A third party (Stripe.com) and not Stuyvesant High School is collecting the AP Exam fees. Payment for AP exams will not be accepted at school. **Payments must be made by Friday, March 8, 2024**. Each AP exam costs \$98 plus a credit card service fee. The late registration fee is \$40 plus a credit card service fee.

Please note the Fee Status at the top of this letter. This indicates whether you are a student who, after qualifying s for economic hardship, will have exam costs covered by the NYC Department of Education (NYC DOE). If your letter indicates that <u>Family Income Inquiry Form</u> was submitted for the 2022-2023 school year, you may apply for hardship support by submitting the form **by Friday**, **February 23**, **2024**, which allows time for your forms to process before the payment deadline. The school will update the student MYAP account with Fee Status information.

Class of 2024 Yearbook sales have begun! Please note that only seniors are photographed and highlighted in this book. **We encourage the class of 2024 to purchase a yearbook using the link from Herff Jones at <u>THIS LINK.</u> The cost of the book is \$75.** 

This past weekend, some class of 2024 seniors and/or their families received an email from Herff Jones, the publisher of the yearbook, offering them the opportunity to purchase a yearbook. Through a miscommunication on the part of the company, the appearance was that this email was from



Stuyvesant High School. While the email was not from the school, it was legitimate and they obtained those email addresses from sales of yearbook ads. The link in the email is also legitimate. There were no phishing or scam links associated with that email. If you purchased a yearbook through that link; it was a legitimate purchase of a Stuyvesant Class of 2024 yearbook. If you received that email, you will also receive an email from Herff Jones today clarifying this information.

**There is no February 1 deadline to purchase a yearbook. We will advise you of a deadline soon.** If there is financial hardship, please reach out directly to Ms. Ingram at ringram3@schools.nyc.gov to discuss.


### **Congrats to Stuy Congress at Liberty Bell Classic!**






to children through UNICEF. Stuyvesant UNICEF is looking forward to hosting more concerts at Howl! Arts this year!



The purpose of the guide is to help students to ask thoughtful questions of admissions staff, tour guides, or, best of all, random students who currently attend the institution.

### **IDNYC Applications for High School Students**

High School students can find <u>information</u> on <u>IDNYC applications</u> at these links! Launched in 2015, IDNYC is a card for all New Yorkers, regardless of immigration status. The free, municipal identification card provides access to a wide variety of <u>services and programs</u> offered by the City. For cardholders age 16 and older, cards are valid for five years from the date

the application was approved. For cardholders under the age of 16, cards are valid for two years from the date the application was approved.

To acquire an ID, high school students can make an appointment through the <u>IDNYC online portal</u> or can visit a site accepting walk-in applicants. For additional information on IDNYC including a FAQ, review the <u>IDNYC online portal</u>.

### Apply for SHSAA Scholarships by 4/15/24!

The Stuyvesant Alumni Scholarships application is now live! The Stuyvesant Alumni Association is awarding over 40 scholarships worth more than \$100,000. The due date is Monday, April 15, 2024. Some answers to common questions on the FAFSA/providing financial information:

- If the students have already provided their colleges with the CSS Profile, they can submit that form in lieu of the FAFSA, but only if they did not submit a FAFSA.
- If the student never filed either the CSS or FAFSA because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident, they should be sure to state it's because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident in







the "Financial aid information" question on the application. All information submitted by the students in their application is kept to the strictest confidentiality. All of the staff and any scholarship committee members, as well as any other additional parties who read the scholarship applications, must sign and adhere to a confidentiality agreement.

Students must provide the financial information listed in the checklist in some form, even if they submit a one-page doc with all of it listed out.
