There are many excellent opportunities in this issue - including several highlighted below. Remember that it is fine to apply to and be accepted by several different programs – students can then just pick the one(s) that are the best fit and decline the others (in a timely way).

And please note that many programs have approaching application deadlines!

EVENTS: All students may attend the in-person Community Board 14 **Youth Programs Summer Fair** on March 6th – the focus is on programs for that borough, but some citywide options will be represented as well. And the **Latin College Expo** event at NYU on March 14th is open to all (juniors are especially encouraged to attend); various college representatives and college-support programs will be there.

BUSINESS/JOBS: The non-profit **NYC Exploring** program welcomes all students to participate in their wide variety of free after-school sessions visiting the offices of major companies, including the fields of engineering, medicine, law, business, and more. Students get to meet professionals who can discuss career pathways, college majors, internships, and other related topics. Some are scheduled for next week – check them out! And the application deadline for the **NYC Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP)** has been extended to March 15th.

LEADERSHIP/LAW/GOVERNMENT: The **Summer Justice Institute** is a free one-week program at the federal courthouse that provides an up-close look at various components of the legal system to current 9th, 10th, and 11th graders.

Democracy Scholars is a free summer residential program at NYU which engages rising seniors in a three-week experience of working with other students & professors on social issues, along with guidance on college admissions. This support continues on an occasional basis in senior year – participants work together throughout the program. It's open to all applicants; first-generation students are encouraged to apply.

STEM: All students may apply for the free in-person introductory **Spring Break Game Design Lab**, offered from April 23-25. The **Simons-NYU Summer Science Exploration** three-week program is open to all current 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students (those from under-represented groups are encouraged to apply). Participants delve into physical and biological science topics, with support from NYU faculty. The **Maimonides Hospital Women in Science** summer program for current students who identify as female is an excellent opportunity to meet and learn from medical researchers, surgeons, and other clinicians. Current sophomores and older students (16 and up) from Manhattan, Staten Island, and the Bronx may apply to one of the two free **Student Health Internship Programs** (SHIP) – participants spend six weeks interacting with medical professionals.

And the **Perry Initiative** (for female-identifying students in the 10th grade or above) offers another in-person event on Saturday, May 4th at the NYU Langone Medical Center in Manhattan. Interested students should apply ASAP.

SCHOLARSHIPS: Our ever-supportive **Alumni Association** welcomes applications for their wide variety of **40+ scholarships** for graduating seniors (and one for a

current junior). These awards are open only to Stuy students – be sure to check the link to learn more!

Some answers to common questions on the FAFSA/providing financial information:

- If the students have already provided their colleges with the CSS Profile, they can submit that form in lieu of the FAFSA, but only if they did not submit a FAFSA.
- If the student never filed either the CSS or FAFSA because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident, they should be sure to state it's because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident in the "Financial aid

information" question on the application. All information submitted by the students in their application is kept to the strictest confidentiality. All of the staff and any scholarship committee members, as well as any other additional parties who read the scholarship applications, must sign and adhere to a confidentiality agreement.

- Students must provide the financial information listed in the checklist in some form, even if they submit a one-page doc with all of it listed out.
