There are many excellent opportunities in this issue - including several highlighted below.

Please note that a good number programs –particularly in the STEM categories- have approaching mid-late **March application deadlines!**

ACADEMICS: The first free **CUNY College Now** college courses for summer are starting to post online. These are typically open to juniors and (sometimes) sophomores. The Hunter College program is listed here. The free **MIT BeaverWorks Spring Classes/Summer Institute** program has a March 31st deadline; this is focused on current juniors, but all may apply.

MUSEUMS/ART: The Museum of Arts & Design's Artslife summer program is a paid opportunity for current 9th and 10th graders to work with museum professionals and artists. **Tech Scholars** at the New York Historical Society is a spring break program, open to all students, which combines web design training with historical issues related to women's rights

STEM: **Carnegie Mellon University** is hosting an online Hacking Competition until March 26th – all may participate. **Columbia University's Synthetic Biology Workshop** welcomes all students to its four-week online program, beginning March 31st. The **Perry Initiative** offers online presentations about medicine & orthopedics to all female & binary students on March 18th and April 13th. Deadline Approaching: MIT Lincoln Laboratory (LL) Beaver Works Summer Institute Spring Class and Summer Program

“This is a dual program – spring term self-paced online classes (open to all juniors, and some 9th and 10th graders may be accepted as well), followed by an in-person or virtual summer program at MIT, which is selective. The four-week program teaches students programming & engineering skills through project-based, workshop-style courses. Students must complete self-paced online courses over the spring semester if they wish to be considered for the summer program. Stuyvesant Alumni Association Scholarships

The Stuyvesant Alumni Association awards more than 40 scholarships totaling more than \$100,000. These scholarships are available only to Stuyvesant seniors. (There is one scholarship available to juniors, The Carol and Theodore Lerner Award for Creativity).

Some answers to common questions on the FAFSA/providing financial information:

- If the students have already provided their colleges with the CSS Profile, they can submit that form in lieu of the FAFSA, but only if they did not submit a FAFSA.
- If the student never filed either the CSS or FAFSA because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident, they should be sure to state it's because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident in the "Financial aid information" question on the application. All information submitted by the students in their application is kept to the strictest confidentiality. All of the staff and any scholarship committee members, as well as any other additional parties who read the scholarship applications, must sign and adhere to a confidentiality agreement.
- Students must provide the financial information listed in the checklist in some form, even if they submit a one-page doc with all of it listed out.
