SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION



As a reminder, the scholarship is designed to identify and reward outstanding high school seniors who have demonstrated an ability to excel in the fields of academics, extra-curricular school activities and community involvement. It is available to any male, graduating senior who is enrolling in a four-year undergraduate college program that commences in the fall of 2024. More than \$50,000 will be awarded in increments of \$500-\$1,000 to be delivered directly to recipients — *not their institution* — via ACH transfer to use as desired.


