The NYC DOE, the New York Yankees, and The Stonewall Inn are proud to announce that applications are open for the **2024 Yankees-Stonewall Scholarship**.

Now in its 6th year, these \$10,000 college scholarships celebrate the achievements of FIVE NYC Public School graduating seniors (one per borough) who have demonstrated impactful support of the LGBTQ community. All graduating seniors in a NYC Public School, intending to attend a 2-year or 4-year college, are eligible to apply online at this <u>link</u>.
