Please note that a good number programs –particularly in the STEM categories- have approaching **late March or early-April application deadlines!**

ACADEMICS: The **New York Math Circle** at NYU welcomes all students to its various spring and summer math workshops – financial aid is available to eligible students. Many of the **CUNY College Now** free summer college-level course schedules at CUNY campuses are now open for registration – these are variously open to 10th, 11th, and 12th graders, depending on the particular program’s guidelines.

JOBS/BUSINESS: The free summer **BossGirls Business/Entrepreneurship program** at City College in Manhattan is accepting applications from students who identify as women or nonbinary. And a number of **summer day camps** around the city are seeking high school student workers for various positions.

STEM: A large number of STEM programs have 3/31 or 4/1 application deadlines – please check them out ASAP! The **CUNY CREST Hires** program at City College focuses on Earth Science and Engineering – it is open to low-income, under-represented (including female), and under-resourced students from all grades

Deadline Approaching: Columbia Engineering's Summer High School Academic Program for Engineers (SHAPE)

“SHAPE is geared toward students with an aptitude for STEM: science, technology, engineering, and mathematics. Each 3-week session offers college-level, project-based courses in engineering taught by prestigious faculty at Columbia University. Courses are primarily in the physical, chemical, biological, behavioral, and computing sciences; and instructors are scientists and mathematicians who are actively engaged in research at the University.”

“Stanford Pre-Collegiate Summer Institutes courses meet two hours each day (Monday–Friday) for live online classroom discussion between the instructor and their students. In addition to the live meeting times, students will engage in out-of-class learning assignments tailored to each course. Through daily interaction and small class

sizes, instructors develop strong connections with their students. At the end of the course, the instructors will provide a qualitative written evaluation.”

***Deadline Approaching:* MIT Lincoln Laboratory (LL) Beaver Works Summer Institute Spring Class and Summer Program**

“This is a dual program – spring term self-paced online classes (open to all juniors, and some 9th and 10th graders may be accepted as well), followed by an in-person or virtual summer program at MIT, which is selective. The four-week program teaches students programming & engineering skills through project-based, workshop-style courses. Students must complete self-paced online courses over the spring semester if they wish to be considered for the summer program. (Students can still apply for the online courses after they are released on February 1st, but should apply as soon as possible.)”
