These first few days of April, NYC is experiencing historic times! Friday, Stuy briefly *shook* with an earthquake, the first of which in the last century of that magnitude! The building response team was activated and all floors were inspected for our students' and faculty safety. Information and protocols were shared with principals from NY Public Schools. History-making continues today, as a partial **solar eclipse** will occur in New York City beginning at 2pm with 90% coverage at about 3:25pm! **Through a generous donation**, **students and faculty will receive free eclipse safety glasses as they enter Stuyvesant this morning at the bridge entrance!** Last Friday, NY Public Schools provided additional information about the solar eclipse. School Day PSAT 10 on April 13, 2024

Stuyvesant will administer the in-school digital PSAT 10 to all Sophomores on **Saturday, April 13, 2024**, during two separate windows (morning and afternoon sessions). Please note, the PSAT 10 exam is optional, not required; and no notice is required if you do not plan to attend. The PSAT 10 is *not* considered for submission for National Merit Scholarships. Only juniors taking the PSAT/NMSQT may use scores for National Merit consideration. The PSAT 10 is a useful practice test for sophomores. We will send a reminder Monday, April 8, 2024, which will include testing

room assignments. If you have approved testing accommodations through the College Board, you will be assigned to the applicable room accordingly.

The College Board has transitioned to a digital version for the PSAT 10. In preparation for the digital version of the PSAT 10, we recommend that you familiarize yourself with what to expect and to practice this new version of the exam. We recommend you read the <u>PSAT 10 Student Guide</u> and visit the College Board site for more information about the PSAT 10. Devices will be provided to students for testing. No personal devices should be brought to the exam.

Ms. Dunkel's students share Dodecahedron projects on Religion



Over the course of 6.5 hours, participants learned to define the key terms (giftedness, 2e, neurotypical and neurodivergent brains) and to clarify misconceptions; to identify the best practices and common challenges in educating gifted and 2e learners; and to understand how to integrate Social and Emotional Learning practices into educating Gifted/2e Learners.



Learning Accommodations in College

Students who qualified for learning accommodations in high school may not be aware that they may be able to obtain accommodations in college as well. Students with any special needs should not allow this to limit their college search; they should evaluate colleges based upon all of the factors that are important to them. But, assessing the availability, quality, and potential additional costs of such services should be a factor to include as they decide upon where they will eventually apply or enroll. *Having an IEP or 504 in high school does NOT automatically entitle a student to accommodations in college.* Students



will need to follow the colleges' accessibility procedures and provide the required documentation to the appropriate office at their college to see what, if any, accommodations they will be entitled to, and how those can be implemented from class to class.

Below arStudents who qualified for learning accommodations in high school may not be aware that they may be able to obtain accommodations in college as well. Students with any special needs should not allow this to limit their college search; they should evaluate colleges based upon all of the factors that are important to them. But, assessing the availability, quality, and potential additional costs of such services should be a factor to include as they decide upon where they will eventually apply or enroll.

This is an important question that has no one answer. Whether or not it might be helpful to disclose when applying (versus after gaining acceptance) really depends upon the specifics of the student, and colleges, in question. Students should make sure to have this discussion with their assigned college counselor before deciding.

- **Risk Free Enrollment Period**: When enrolled from the waitlist on the automatic payment plan, folks can cancel for any reason up to 14 days after enrollment for a full refund of 100% of the money paid to EF.

NEW COVID GUIDELINES IN EFFECT!

<u>Effective immediately:</u>

The NYC Public Schools (NYCPS) have updated its COVID-19 policy based on the updated CDC health guidance. Instead of a minimum isolation period of 5 days, the CDC recommends people with COVID-19 should stay



home and away from others based on their symptoms, similar to how they would for any other respiratory infections, like flu and respiratory syncytial virus (RSV). Consequently, there will no longer be a COVID intake form for reporting positive test results to the school. Students should follow and use the regular <u>absence</u> <u>protocol</u> upon a student's return to school.

If someone has <u>COVID-19</u> symptoms, they should still get tested and separate from others immediately. It is recommended that they stay home until they have had no fever without taking fever-reducing medicine and other COVID-19 symptoms have improved for at least 24 hours. If they test positive for COVID-19 but have no symptoms, there is no need to stay home, but precautions should be taken upon return to school such as wearing a mask. The NYCPS will continue to provide COVID-19 test kits upon request. You may pick up a test kit in room 103 if needed.

Some answers to common questions on the FAFSA/providing financial information:

- If the students have already provided their colleges with the CSS Profile, they can submit that form in lieu of the FAFSA, but only if they did not submit a FAFSA.
- If the student never filed either the CSS or FAFSA because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident, they should be sure to state it's because they are not a citizen or legal permanent resident in the "Financial aid information" question on the application. All information submitted by the students in their application is kept to the strictest confidentiality. All of the staff and any scholarship committee members, as well as any other additional parties who read the scholarship applications, must sign and adhere to a confidentiality agreement.
- Students must provide the financial information listed in the checklist in some form, even if they submit a one-page doc with all of it listed out.

Eco-Fact of the Week!

The coral reefs, a place of high biodiversity, provided a home for about 25% of all the marine species, ranging from the chocolate chip sea stars to the long-spined porcupine fish. However, their beauty and wonders might not last, as high ocean temperatures and marine heatwaves were increasing the rates of coral bleaching. Corals began to bleach when they were under stress (ex: temperature changes, pH, etc.), causing them to release the colorful algae that supplies their nutrients. When they were under stress for more than 8 weeks, they would not be able to recover and they would die. Unfortunately, due to rising global



temperatures, many more corals are going to bleach, and there would be less places to support all the marine species! Help to preserve our resources and properly sort your trash!



Appealing Financial Aid for College -- Advice!

Choosing where to attend college can have major financial implications, and most of our families need to consider costs when making their final decision. Here are general steps to appeal for more financial aid if your aid packages from these colleges do not leave you with affordable options:

• If the college has an appeal process or form on the financial aid page of their website, follow those instructions. Otherwise, contact the financial aid office and find out who your specific counselor is



- Contact that person directly via email. If no specific party is assigned, then just email the undergraduate financial aid office. You may also want to include the admissions office on the email to keep them in the loop.
- Express why COLLEGE is a great choice for you, then let them know you can't afford that college at the current cost, and why.
- Include any relevant details they won't have already seen from your FAFSA or CSS profile; loss of income for 2023 or 2024, parent recent loss of job, new expenses, etc. Be prepared to include any supporting documentation (such as the family's 2023 1040, if requested).
- If you got a better offer from another institution, you can cite that...but be aware that some colleges, particularly those highly selective private colleges that only offer need -based aid, may not entertain appeal requests of that nature. That will often be stated on the college's website.
- Remember, they don't owe you anything. You are asking them to devote extra time and attention to your case. So, in all of your communications, make sure to be kind and respectful at all times.

Whether or not an appeal request will actually result in more aid will vary a great deal based upon the college in question, the individual applicant and their financial circumstances, etc. But, you do not have to fear any negative consequences of appealing an aid package; if you are in a difficult situation and need to appeal, you can certainly do so. It won't hurt to have made that request.

Do keep in mind that the CUNY system is often the most affordable option for many families. While the initial deadline of February 1 has passed, you may still apply to CUNY institutions if you need:
