Spring break is a great time to check these opportunities and submit applications – many programs have rapidly approaching deadlines – several are highlighted below:

EVENTS: The Manhattan District Attorney's office will do a presentation for students with an interest in law at Apex for Youth in downtown Manhattan on April 23rd. Two science-focused career fairs for students will be offered by York College in Queens (May 4th) and the New York Hall of Science (May 17th). And free once-aweek dance lessons in Hip Hop, Contemporary, and other dance styles are available to Stuy students in May by professional instructors from Battery dance – no experience required!
